MIKEY MAKES ANOTHER SAVE

Nearly five months after suffering sudden cardiac arrest during Toronto's Half Marathon, Toronto police Constable **Andrew Rosbrook** is on a team of over 250 law enforcement professionals who participated in the **National Peace Officers' Memorial**

Run To Remember in September. His commitment to run his fourth relay is in part because of a **MIKEY** defibrillator.

The 460-kilometre Run to Remember started at the Ontario Police Memorial at Queen's Park in Toronto. The three-day relay ended in Ottawa, where the annual Police and Peace Officers' Memorial Service happened on Parliament Hill.

In May, 2013, as Rosbrook was

about to finish his race, he collapsed with no sign of breathing or heartbeat. In seconds, Detective Constable **Laurie McCann**, with an off-duty doctor and a paramedic trainee performed CPR until paramedics arrived with a portable MIKEY.

After being shocked once, Rosbrook's heart

began beating. He was then taken by ambulance to Toronto's St. Michael's Hospital. "Const. Rosbrook is our 16th save," said MIKEY Network chairman **Hugh Heron**, who is also the president of **Heathwood Homes**. "His miraculous recovery has allowed him to participate in a sport that he loves, and is true testimony to his second chance at life."
